Last year, 152 local Healthwatch...



- Spoke to over 385,000 people to find out their views.
- Made over 3,500 visits to find out if local services work for people.

- CQC publication of the 'State of Care' report
  - using a 20<sup>th</sup> century model of care which needs to be moved into the 21<sup>st</sup> century
  - Two key factors leadership & culture
- Issue of Annual Report from Healthwatch England
  - gives update to Parliament and the public on how we find the state of public experience.
  - Mental Health top of list where we hear most views and experiences
